**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Portsmouth Naval Shipyard (PNSY), one of four remaining naval shipyards in the nation, sits at the mouth of the Piscataqua River in between Kittery, Maine and Portsmouth, New Hampshire. PNSY encompasses over 297 acres including the main base and a family housing site off base in Kittery.

For this project, TANTARA was contracted to provide all labor, material, equipment, transportation, supervision and incidental work related to the demolition and removal of Portal Crane #21 at the shipyard.

The project involved special requirements for containment and disposal of asbestos-contaminated materials (ACM), as well as other hazardous materials such as lead paint.

Because the project site is an operating Navy facility, TANTARA coordinated carefully with local personnel not only to comply with all PNSY regulations, but also to permit Navy Operations be performed during the course of work, and ensure work allowed access for emergency response vehicles during and after project execution.

TANTARA disposed of all removed materials in accordance with PNSY, local, state and federal regulations. We also restored any disturbed surrounding areas. All waste generated during preparation (wash water, paint chips, steel debris, and so forth) was contained and disposed of properly. Upon completion of the project work, TANTARA cleared the work area of all equipment, tools, materials, debris and dust to the satisfaction of the Contracting Officer.
